What is the quality of the sensuous and how can it be explored? How can we truly inhabit the poetic and bring it into our daily lives? How can we develop new modes of being and being together? How can we inhabit art more permanently? What would a future society look like from the premise of the sensuous and poetic? And not at least - How can we inhabit it?

These are some of the questions one could explore if you seek to respond to this call as a visiting inhabitant/researcher/ artist/teacher/activist at *Sisters Hope Home*. For a **short stay** you will inhabit *Sisters Hope Home* during our format *Flowing Inhabitation* where you will engage with the present inhabitants and Sisters staff for a 4-day period from Thursday to Sunday.

For a **long stay** you will inhabit Sisters Hope Home continuously for a month. The stay will begin and end during a Flowing Inhabitation. In-between you will inhabit the Home alone or with few other visiting inhabitants. During this time, we expect you to immerse in your own practice. As such the long stay is for visiting inhabitants who are looking for an immersive artistic frame in which to unfold and further explore existing practices.

#### About Sisters Hope

Our ambition is to make the sensuous and poetic accessible to as many people as possible - to 'democratize the aesthetic'. Our work is based on an imagined future society - The Sensuous Society - where the sensuous and poetic form the base for all action and interaction. Out of the current ecological and economic crises, a new poetic society has emerged which our works have as their starting point.

Our work unfolds at the intersection of performance art, research and activism and intervenes into different everyday life contexts and institutions. Our performative manifestations are highly immersive and sense-stimulating and apply interactivity to create transformative encounters and create poetic universes.

Please send a letter of motivation of 500 words in which you describe why you want to participate, how *Sisters Hope Home* is relevant as a framework for your explorations and how you would like to contribute. Please include a 200-word biographical statement and send it to: <u>sistershope@sistershope.dk</u> no later than January 30th.

For the long stay visiting, you must also include a work plan and describe the expected outcome of your stay. You must specify which of the following time slots that you apply:

## Short stay:

I: February 16th - February 19th II: March 23rd - March 26th III: April 20th - April 23rd IV: June 8th - June 12th

Long stay: I: March 23rd - April 23rd

#### Practical information

Once accepted as a visiting inhabitant we will call for a preparatory meeting.

At Sisters Hope Home you will get a bed in the dormitory and during the *Flowing Inhabitations* we will provide three meals a day. As a long stay visiting you must acquire you own groceries in-between Flowing Inhabitations. Sisters Hope Home is analogue, and you should not use digital devices during your stay.

All participants donate their in-situ data to our open-source Archive before departure. It is possible to copy your data before departure - But think creatively as *Sisters Hope Home* is analogue. You can access The Archive when at *Sisters Hope Home* or afterwards by request. It is not possible to document your own work by photo or film while at *Sisters Hope Home*.

For long stay visitors: At the end of your stay, we offer the opportunity for you to present the outcome of your explorations and/or your work-in-progress reflections.
