At Sisters Hope Home you will get a bed in the dormitory and during the manifestations we will provide three meals a day. You will stay at Sisters Hope Home for the entirety of your stay.

You can access The Archive when at *Sisters Hope Home* or afterwards by request. It is not possible to document your own work by photo or film while at *Sisters Hope Home*.
